

JOB DESCRIPTION—MINISTER OF FELLOWSHIP

Primary function.—To lead the church to grow warmer by providing kingdom leadership in the area of fellowship.

General function.—To work with and under the direction of the senior pastor as a member of the pastoral team to enable the church to focus on the Great Commission and to equip the church to carry out the five functions of the New Testament church: evangelism, discipleship, ministry, fellowship, and worship.

RESPONSIBILITIES

Leading

- To train and equip members of the church in the cultivation of the spiritual discipline of fellowship.

Administering

- To provide the direction and oversight for the assimilation of new members into the life of the church.

Ministering

- To create opportunities for the members of the church to network effectively with one another, nurturing healthy relationships within the body of the church and developing relationships with those in the community.

Communicating

- The minister of fellowship will preach and teach the Bible, believing that it has God for its author, salvation for its end, and truth without any mixture of error for its matter.
- The minister of fellowship will work with the senior pastor in communicating the vision for ministry that God gives to this congregation.

EXPECTATIONS

- The minister of fellowship is expected to be a servant leader.
- The minister of fellowship is expected to live an exemplary life modeling the call, character, and competencies becoming a minister of the gospel of Jesus Christ.

RELATIONSHIPS

- As a member of the pastoral team of this church, the minister of fellowship is responsible to the senior pastor in all matters of church administration. In the absence of a senior pastor, the minister of fellowship will be responsible to the interim team leader named during the time of transition.
