

JOB DESCRIPTION—MINISTER OF WORSHIP

Primary function.—To lead the church to grow stronger by providing kingdom leadership in the area of worship.

General function.—To work with and under the direction of the senior pastor as a member of the pastoral team to enable the church to focus on the Great Commission and to equip the church to carry out the five functions of the New Testament church: evangelism, discipleship, ministry, fellowship, and worship.

RESPONSIBILITIES

Leading

- To enlist and equip all members of the worship team including but not limited to: choir members, ensembles, small groups, soloists, instrumentalists, drama team members, technical crews, and ushers.

Administering

- To provide oversight and direction to the worship and intercession ministries of the church, including the oversight of the budget for these areas.

Ministering

- To assist the senior pastor with the pastoral care responsibilities of the church and community, especially with regard to the members of the worship teams.

Communicating

- The minister of worship will preach and teach the Bible, believing that it has God for its author, salvation for its end, and truth without any mixture of error for its matter.
- The minister of worship will work with the senior pastor in communicating the vision for ministry that God gives to this congregation.

EXPECTATIONS

- The minister of worship is expected to be a servant leader.
- The minister of worship is expected to live an exemplary life modeling the call, character, and competencies becoming a minister of the gospel of Jesus Christ.

RELATIONSHIPS

- As a member of the pastoral team of this church, the minister of worship is responsible to the senior pastor in all matters of church administration. In the absence of a senior pastor, the minister of worship will be responsible to the interim team leader named during the time of transition.
